TOPIC OF THE MONTH: HELPFUL TIPS FOR USING THE ONLINE RESOURCE CATALOG

How to View Online - Your Current Check-Outs and/or Reserves:

In order to activate this optional feature, you need to:

- Complete a Patron Registration Form in the Library, if you've not already done so. (Please update us, if any information changes.)
- **Visit the Library and compose a special PIN number** just for this purpose. It will be entered in your patron profile and you will be given a small form that shows your PIN number and your Patron ID (barcode) number, for your personal use.
- To view your information, access our Online Resource Catalog at: <u>library.gracecommunityaz.com</u>, which now has a new "look." In the Account menu at the upper right, select Log On and then enter both your Patron ID and your PIN number; then Log On. For Grace Library hours and contact information, select the INFO button in the lower left corner of the Catalog screen.

Tips for Searching the Catalog:

- **For a simple keyword** search, enter the title, author, keyword, or subject in the search screen (which is in the upper left corner). If multiple results appear, scroll down to find the resource desired; then select it for more information. If too many results appear, it might be helpful to select one of the *Sort By* options, or do a more advanced search.
- **If you wish to be more specific in your search** for the title, author, keyword and/or subject, select an *Expert* or *Combo* Search. These types of searches are explained on the screen that appears when you select the *Search* tab.
- **If your desired resource is currently checked-out**, you may ask us (in person, by phone or by email) to *reserve* it for you. We will contact you, and hold it for up to a week, when it is returned. At this time, *reserves* may not be initiated directly through our *Catalog* software.
- If you wish to compile a printable list of multiple titles you select (called a Mediagraphy or Bookbag) within the same online session, select the plus icon on the right, just above each specific item of interest. It will then change to a check mark. If you wish to add the entire page to your Bookbag, select the double plus icon Repeat the process for each additional page or search. When done, on the Account screen by Mediagraphy, select View. Everything you selected will temporarily be displayed on one list, which you may edit, if desired. It is suggested that you then print it out, and bring it with you to the Library at your convenience. The Catalog automatically deletes your list when you exit.
- There are occasional random times when the catalog is not available due to maintenance, updates or other issues. If you can't access it, please try again shortly, or contact the Library to help you.
- **If you don't find what you're looking for in our Library**, feel free to recommend that resource for possible later addition to our collection. Or, you may check multiple public and academic library holdings for this item by one simple search at: http://worldcat.org.

Finding Additional New Title Listings in the Catalog:

• To see an expanded list of new titles in the Catalog, select the *Visual* tab, and then *Recent Additions* from the main search screen. About 72 of the newest titles added in the last two months, in all formats, will display on multiple pages. Select any title for more information. Our monthly *Grace Library News* only has enough space to list some of these titles, but you may see them all listed online!





(Book by Tim Chester; 192 pages; ©2010 by Crossway)




